<b>Aug 19 2023</b>	<b>Rear Window (1954)</b> A photographer in a wheelchair spies on his neighbors from his Greenwich Village courtyard apartment window, and becomes convinced one of them has committed murder, despite the skepticism of his fashion-model girlfriend. ... <i>one of Hitchcocks masterpieces.</i>
<b>Sep 16 2023</b>	<b>7 Boxes (2012)</b> A teenage delivery boy working in a popular Paraguayan market must dodge thieves, rival gangs and the omnipresent police when he undertakes a dangerous contract to transport a load of mysterious - and highly sought-after - crates to the edge of town. ... <i>a festival hit in 2012, gaining nominations for the Discovery and International Critics awards at Toronto.</i>
<b>Oct 14 2023</b>	<b>Charulata (1964)</b> Based on a novella by the great Rabindranath Tagore, <i>Charulata</i> is a work of subtle textures, a delicate tale of a marriage in jeopardy and a woman taking the first steps toward establishing her own voice. <i>Indian master director Satyajit Ray once described this as his favourite of his own films, and it's easy to see why. This is a work of extraordinary grace, poise and intelligence whose closest parallel is probably 'Brief Encounter'</i>
<b>Nov 18 2023</b>	<b>A Quiet Girl (2022)</b> Rural Ireland 1981. A quiet, neglected girl is sent away from her dysfunctional family to live with foster parents for the summer. She blossoms in their care, but in this house where there are meant to be no secrets, she discovers one. ... <i>one of the most exquisitely realised films of the year.</i>
<b>Dec 9 2023</b>	<b>Malcolm (1986)</b> A tram enthusiast becomes involved with a pair of would-be bank robbers ... <i>brilliant low budget off beat Australian comedy</i>
<b>Dec 23 2023</b>	<b>The Curious Case of Benjamin Button (2008)</b> Tells the story of a man born in his 80s who ages backwards as he attempts to meet the love of his life before regressing to childhood.... <i>an epic fantasy tale with rich storytelling backed by fantastic performances.</i>

<b>Jan 13 2024</b>	<b>Franklin (2022)</b> The story of Australia's most significant environmental battle to save the remote Franklin River from being dammed by a hydroelectric project in the 1980s, as told through the lens of a current-day solo rafting adventure. .... <i>reminds us that we must fight to protect our democratic rights and freedoms. We must protest and defend our right to do so. A generation before us did so four decades ago, and we now reap the benefits. We must do so again today.</i>
<b>Jan 27 2024</b>	<b>Jojo Rabbit (2019)</b> A young German boy in the Hitler Youth whose hero and imaginary friend is the country's dictator is shocked to discover that his mother is hiding a Jewish girl in their home. <i>.A twisted piece of grandly entertaining provocation. ... This is a dark satire that finds a way to make a case for understanding.</i>
<b>Feb 17 2024</b>	<b>Tangerines (2013)</b> In 1992, war rages in Abkhazia, a breakaway region of Georgia. An Estonian man Ivo has decided to stay behind and harvest his crops of tangerines. In a bloody conflict at his door, a wounded man is left behind, and Ivo takes him in. ... <i>one of the highlights of the Montreal World Film Festival 2014.</i>
<b>Mar 23 2024</b>	<b>To be announced</b>
<b>Apr 20 2024</b>	<b>Il Posto (1961)</b> Bursting with big dreams and plans, an Italian teen goes to Milan to work in a big impersonal corporate office... <i>...a quiet, sadly humorous movie about the dehumanization of two people who obtain "a job for life" in a major Northern Italian corporation.</i>
<b>May 18 2024</b>	<b>The First Cow (2019)</b> A skilled cook has traveled west and joined a group of fur trappers in Oregon, though he only finds true connection with a Chinese immigrant also seeking his fortune. Soon the two collaborate on a successful business. ... <i>fundamentally a western: It takes up questions of civilization, solidarity and barbarism on the American frontier. And like many great westerns it critiques some of the genre's foundational myths with bracing, beautiful rigor, including the myth of heroic individualism.</i>
